

# Getting out and about in the community

#### The Disabled Persons Railcard

The Disabled Persons Railcard is for people with a disability that makes travelling by train difficult. You will get 1/3rd off rail tickets. If the person you care for has a Disabled Persons Railcard you will be able to get 1/3rd off your ticket too (this is for anyone travelling with them – you don't need to prove you are a carer). You can get a discount at any time of day.

#### **National Entitlement Card**

The person you care for may be entitled to free bus travel with the National Entitlement Card if they are registered disabled, they are blind or partially sighted, deaf or unable to speak. They can't walk very far because of a disability, illness or injury or don't have arms or can't use their arms.

### Travelling with the person you care for:

If you need to travel with a companion, they're entitled to travel for free if your National Entitlement Card has the Companion Travel logo on it. Please note you will require some evidence of this when completing the application.

## The Companion Card

The Companion Card is issued to people with a significant or profound, permanent disability, who can demonstrate that they are unable to access most community activities and venues without high-level attendant care support. The card will allow their carer to travel with them.

### **MyBus**

MyBus is a bookable bus service offering door-to-door transport in your area. MyBus can be used for shopping, GP appointments, visiting friends, attending local clubs, and much more. MyBus will pick you up and drop you off as close as possible to your destination. All vehicles are low-floor and wheelchair friendly. The driver will give assistance to board the bus from the pavement. However, the driver is unable to provide assistance from your home to the bus. MyBus will pick you up and drop you off as close as possible to your destination.
